
Online Privacy Policy

Your privacy is important to us. Any personal data collected through this website will be processed by CAPE IP Law as a data controller, in accordance with applicable data protection laws and regulations. Personal data will not be transferred to third parties unless this is strictly necessary. This notice explains our online and offline information practices and the choices you can make about the way your information is used on our website (www.cape-iplaw.com) and/or by our attorneys.

The information we collect

We do not collect personally identifiable information about you – such as your name, address, telephone number, fax number, e-mail address, etc. – unless you choose to fill out the form at <http://www.cape-iplaw.com/site/contact>.

We do automatically collect certain non-personally identifiable information when you visit our site – such as the type of browser you are using, the type of operating system you are using, and the domain name of your internet service provider.

How we normally use information about you

We use non-personally identifiable information to analyse site usage (such as aggregated information on the pages visited by our users), which allows us to improve the design and content of our site.

In the ordinary course, we use personally identifiable information you provide solely to respond to your inquiry or to process the contact form that you have completed at <http://www.cape-iplaw.com/site/contact>.

Additionally, we process your personal data when you have indicated on our website that you wish to subscribe to our newsletter. In that case, we will contact you with a newsletter in relation to subjects that we believe to be of interest to you. We process this information based on your consent or based on the legitimate interest of CAPE IP Law to keep its clientele informed of its services. You are free to choose to provide us with your personal data for this purpose, and you may withdraw your consent at any time (see below).

We will take due care to ensure that the personal data that is collected and processed by CAPE IP Law is accurate and that we do not process more of your personal data than what is necessary to adequately serve your interests. We will not store your personal data for a period longer than necessary for the purposes stated above. We take adequate safeguards to ensure appropriate security of your personal data.

Subject to the obligations incumbent on CAPE IP Law based on legislation combatting money laundering operations and the financing of terrorism or any other legally binding provisions, CAPE IP Law will not intentionally reveal personal data allowing the deduction of your identity to any third parties, including your e-mail address, without your prior consent.

We respect the confidentiality of your e-mail, and will not send unsolicited mail from the CAPE IP Law domain. Nor will we share, rent, or sell your personally identifiable information outside CAPE IP Law. If you are interested in applying for a job at CAPE IP Law and choose to submit resume information by email, we will use it only for the internal application review process.

It is possible, though unlikely, that we might be forced to disclose personally identifiable information in response to legal process or when we believe in good faith that the law requires it, for example, in response to a court order, subpoena or a law enforcement agency's request.
